OL Chemistry Course Guidelines

Grading Policy*

Grading for Chemistry will occur through daily work, tests and lab work.

Labs/Activities will account for 40% of each six week grade.

Daily/Quizzes will account for 30% of a six week grade

Labs will count for 30% including lab performance and formal lab assessments and will include labs in which multiple skills, processes and content will be assessed.

Retest Policy

Students who earn less than a 70% on an assessment have the option to retake that assessment for up to a 70%. All retakes MUST be completed by 9 am on Friday of the last week of the 9 week period. Any work received past that point will not be accepted. The student will have one opportunity to retake. In order to qualify for a retest, the student must complete relevant assignments and/or supporting activities as directed by the teacher.

This may include, but is not limited to:

- Completion and/or correction of related assignments.
- Attending tutorials and correcting quizzes.

Absences

It is the student's responsibility to collect missing assignments, complete, and submit all work. Students who are unable to attend class will be expected to email their teacher on or before the day of the absence to receive make-up work. The chemistry teachers are extremely willing to work with absent students and help them keep up with the course material from home. The expectation is that students will communicate their absences with their teachers.

Late Work/Opportunity for Improvement*

To be successful in chemistry, it is important that work be submitted in a timely manner. This ensures that students are receiving feedback in an equally timely manner. Our goal is for the late work policy to assist students in keeping current with their progress.

Late work policy:

- Each assignment will have a set due date.
- Work that is late may receive up to a 70% and must be turned in by 9 am on Friday of the last week of the 9 week period. Any work received past that point will not be accepted.
- If an assessment is missed, the student will have 2 weeks, **or** until the end of the 9 weeks (whichever is sooner) to take the test for full credit. After this time, the maximum grade for the test is a 70%.

Opportunity for Improvement

- Grades less than a 70% on daily assignments will be eligible for an "upgrade" if you can demonstrate you have learned the material on the unit test or corresponding major lab.
- Upgrades will be for a maximum of 70%.
